

# CHIEF RABBAN



Greetings Nobles.

With all the social distancing and self-isolation going on, many of us are spending more time online even when we're not in a Skype or Zoom meeting. Navigating the many websites that deal with Freemasonry can be a full-time hobby, and I'm only counting the positive, accurate ones, not the crazy conspiracy sites that link us with UFOs or ancient hidden treasures. I enjoy reading Brother Chris Hodapp's splendid blog, and I came across a few interesting older items. Some of you may recognize Brother Chris as the author of "Freemasons for Dummies" and several other books. One of the articles on his blog, or "web log" was about being visible as Masons at events where people, especially potential members, tend to gather. His

experience was at an RV gathering and he wondered why the local Shrine Nomads didn't have an information table or a pancake breakfast booth there. He mentioned that many people are craving personal, face-to-face interaction in this age of impersonal commerce and online social media. There are opportunities in large and even small gatherings of people who come for one hobby or interest and might be intrigued enough by Freemasonry to ask about it... if only they happen to find a Mason to ask.

The other article went the other direction, praising the internet with allowing communication between groups of Masons that would otherwise have "remained at a perpetual distance." The ease of anonymous discussions in chat groups and the older online bulletin board systems could have been the starting point of Prince Hall recognition negotiations (in Brother Hodapp's opinion.)

Can we have it both ways? Can public gatherings, in-person interaction and connection over social media all take place? Well, yes! Maybe not all at the same time, but it's doable. Consider that a public event can be planned and advertised online, a Masonic presence coordinated and face-to-face meetings happen at he event. It just takes some planning, effort and attendance. Remember that "80% of success is just showing up." Of course, face-to-face meetings have to be held carefully now, once we're allowed to hold meetings again. In the meantime we must increase our online presence to prepare for society opening up again. Hopefully it will be soon.

Instead of writing my normal type article this month, I decided this month to take a lighter approach and share the history of something that is probably a part of all our Easter celebrations.

The item I am talking about is peeps and how the chick went from handmade delicacy to industrial candy success story.

Peeps are produced by Just Born, in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania. Just Born has produced Peeps since 1953.

In 1953, it took 27 hours to create one Peeps Marshmallow Chick. Today, thanks to advances in technology, it takes six minutes.

Just Born produces enough Peeps Brand Marshmallow Candies in one year to circle the Earth twice. Peeps Brand Candies have been the No. 1 non-chocolate brand at Easter for more than 20 years.

In the late 1950s, Peeps wings were "clipped" to give them a sleek, modern look.

Yellow is America's best-selling color of Peeps chicks and bunnies. Yellow and white Peeps chicks and bunnies came first, followed by pink, lavender, blue, green and orange.

If you had 8,000 Peeps bunnies, and you stood them in a straight vertical line, you could reach the top of the Willis Tower in Chicago.

They are best known for Easter, but they recently were marketed for as "Always in Season." You can buy versions for Halloween, Christmas and Valentine's Day.

For nearly seven decades, Peeps have been showing up in Easter baskets and blowing up in microwaves across the globe. However, the history of Easter's (surprisingly) only fifth most popular candy is actually quite complicated.

Today, Peeps inspires a cult following. There are creative dioramas, celebrity chef recipes and competitive eating contests. This year, in five minutes, the winner ate 255 Peeps. Please don't try to eat that many peeps in one sitting or you may end up with an upset stomach.

Alright, on a more serious note, we did have to make the decision to postpone the Spring Fling until later in the year and once we have a new date, I will be sure to announce that.

Pam and I really miss being able to see all of you in person and hope that we will be able to get started on all of the great activities that Mike and Abeer have planned for this year very soon.

I can't believe that a year ago we were just returning home from spending some time at Disney World, after Pam and Tom were finished with the Oriental Guide Conference, which also reminds me that Mary Ann and I would have been there at the beginning of this month. March has marked many improvements for our family: I was able to return to work after 8 months off with cancer treatments, our son, Nathan, was able to return to in-person learning (with lots of precautions in place, of course), it looks as if Mary Ann may be able to return to teaching in her classroom at the beginning of April (lots of prayers are needed for that transition), and, most importantly, all the adults in our family have been able to get our COVID vaccines. I feel like the Lord has blessed our family and is guiding us through this challenging time.



In these times of uncertainty, my family has tried to always stay positive. I keep coming back to a quote from Mr. Rogers, which you have undoubtedly heard already, "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, 'Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping.'" As masons, it is our job to improve the quality of this world and to make good men better. As you navigate this crazy world we live in, I encourage you to think about how you can be a helper. For each of us, this will look differently based on our time and abilities. Recently, a Past Master in my Lodge shared a story on Facebook from the California Freemason website (the full article can be found here: <a href="https://californiafreemason.org/2020/01/30/how-destiny-chose-walter-wilcox/">https://californiafreemason.org/2020/01/30/how-destiny-chose-walter-wilcox/</a>). The story tells about a 4-year old boy in 1878, Walter Cary Wilcox who travelled by train

from Louisiana to Oakland because he was orphaned when his mother died of the yellow fever epidemic. The people who arranged his mother's funeral found a Masonic watch in her belongings and called the Grand Lodge of Louisiana. The Grand Lodge purchased his train ticket to reunite him with his grandmother in California. When he arrived in Oakland, he was welcomed by the sitting Grand Master. The Grand Lodge of California was so taken by his story that they made him a ward of the fraternity, helping pay for his care. He became known as "The Mason's Boy" and was taken in by the Grand Treasurer when his grandmother passed away in 1888. He followed in his "adopted" fraternal father's footsteps and was raised a Master Mason on May 11, 1895 at Oakland Lodge No. 188.

This story really touched me. There are so many more stories like this, of how Brothers have met their Fraternal calling, that we will never hear. We may not know an orphaned child, or a young woman on a train, but we live in a world that is full of opportunities! Maybe we can start with some <u>intentional</u> acts of kindness. Start by smiling at a stranger in the grocery store, bringing your elderly neighbor's trash cans in for them, or buying someone else's Starbucks drink. How can we make our community a better place? How can we be a light when we are surrounded by darkness? How can you silently represent our Shrine and improve the world around you?

Mary Ann and I hope that you have a blessed Easter enjoying time with your families and loved ones and pray for the health of each and every one of you.



# Houston, we are a "Go"!

The 147th Imperial Session is planned for July 4–8 in "Space City" — Houston, Texas. Organizers are looking forward to presenting a safe and exciting time of fun and fellowship for nobles and ladies, particularly since we missed out on last year's traditional gathering.

While conducting the business of the fraternity is an important reason for getting together at Imperial Session, the event is really about a lot more than that.

"We are working to put together a very noble-centric Session," said Director General Charlie Farnham. "Whole groups of nobles are coming for the fellowship. We want it to be a fun time for them."

Nobles from all over attend Imperial Session, attracted by the club and unit competitions, parades and hoopla.

But best of all is the chance to simply meet and enjoy the company of other Shriner families.

"We want everyone to have a good time and socialize, which is something we haven't been able to do for a while," Farnham said.

Organizers remain extremely mindful of the need to keep health and wellbeing at the forefront this year. The fraternity is working on a comprehensive health and safety plan and is collaborating with the local convention corporation, along with the venues and city agencies, to be certain we are following up-to-date guidelines to reduce risk and improve opportunities for fun and fellowship.

While Session is expected to run as close as possible to normal, planners are working to implement specific changes that they believe are necessary to protect the health and safety of nobles and guests.

"Safety is critical, and all attendees' safety is being considered," Farnham said. "We are designing things with safety in mind, in this new world."

According to Visit Houston, George R. Brown is the first convention center in the world to deploy the Integrated Viral Protection (IVP) system. This biodefense filtration technology is proven to eliminate SARS-CoV-2 (99.999%) and other airborne contaminants, and was recently awarded the 2020 Emerging Technology Award by The American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

Session will include an array of fun and interesting social activities. Imperial Potentate Jim Smith is excited to be hosting a special cornhole tournament at Session and has challenged every temple to field a team to compete. This friendly competition will also be supporting a special cause — the tournament entry fees will be donated to First Lady Alice Smith's Rising Stars program.

Something special that many nobles may enjoy is a tour of the nearest hospital, located in Galveston. This bus trip will give nobles who are interested the opportunity to see the hospital, which recently merged with the Houston location to create Shriners Children's Texas.

In addition to Session events, nobles have the opportunity to explore a unique and exciting city when they visit Houston, the fourth-largest city in the United States. Nobles and their families can visit historic sites, museums, the Space Center, or explore the shopping and dining options.
